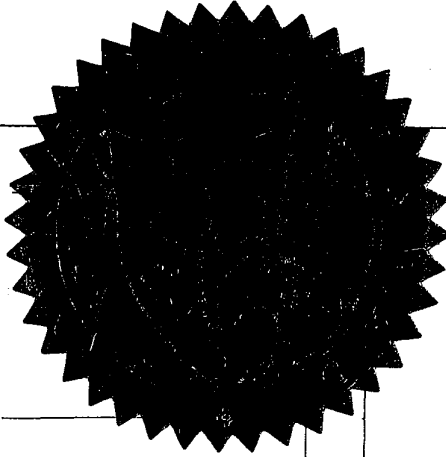

AN ACT to appropriate sixty-six million eleven thousand and two hundred twenty dollars to the service of the year ending the 31st December, 1984.

ENACTED by the National Parliament of Solomon Islands.

ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS

SECTION

1. Short title.
2. Authorisation of issue from the Consolidated Fund of \$66,011,220 to the service of 1984.
3. Appropriation.
4. Overdrafts and advances.
5. Development loans.
6. Advances Warrants.
7. Contingencies Warrants.

1. This Act may be cited as the 1984 Appropriation Act 1983.

Short title.

2. The issue from the Consolidated Fund is hereby authorised of a sum of sixty-six million eleven thousand two hundred and twenty dollars to be applied to the service of the year ending 31st December, 1984.

Authorisation of issue from the Consolidated Fund of \$66,011,220 to the service of 1984.

3. The sum specified in the preceding section shall be appropriated for the supply of the heads specified, and in the amounts respectively specified in relation thereto, in the First Schedule.

Appropriation.

4. The Government may, at any time or times not later than the 31st December, 1984, borrow by way of overdraft and advances within or outside Solomon Islands, or partly within and partly outside Solomon Islands, any sum not exceeding in the whole three and half million dollars on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Finance may deem expedient.

Overdrafts and advances.

5. (1) The Government may, in addition to its borrowings under the provisions of section 4, borrow or enter into agreements to borrow on such terms and conditions as it may determine amounts up to such sums of money for such purposes and from such sources as are respectively specified in the first, second and third columns of the Second Schedule.

Development loans.

(2) No amounts may be borrowed under subsection (1) except in accordance with an agreement under that subsection entered into on or before 31st December, 1984.

(3) The Government shall not without first obtaining the further authority of Parliament borrow for the purposes ascribed thereto any sum or sums in excess of the figure shown in the first column of the Second Schedule.

(4) The Minister shall report to Parliament at the meeting next following such borrowing or agreement any borrowing or the making of any agreement to borrow money under subsection (1).

6. The total of the sums authorised by advances warrants issued by the Minister in exercise of his powers under section 13 of the Public Finance and Audit Act 1978 for the financial year 1984 shall not at any one time exceed one and half million dollars.

Advances Warrants.

Contingencies Warrants.

7. The total sums authorised by contingencies warrants issued by the Minister in exercise of his powers under section 15 of the Public Finance and Audit Act 1978 for the financial year 1984 shall not exceed the following amounts:

- (a) in respect of Heads of Recurrent Expenditure, one and half million dollars;
- (b) in respect of Heads of Development Expenditure, one and half million dollars.
